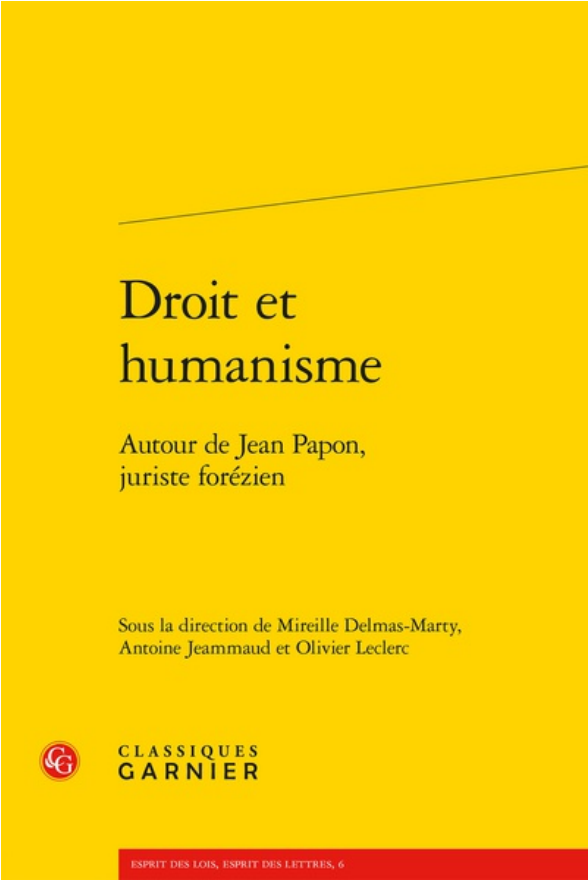


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Jean Papon et les passions du juge

- **Abstract:** When Jean Papon considers the passions of the judge, notably in his *Trias judiciaire du second notaire*, he does not condemn them all and even suggests that some can be useful. He does not, therefore, express a preference for neo-stoicism, even though this was the philosophy which was the most widespread amongst the class of lawyers to which he belonged. He adopts an Augustinian vision : passions are good or bad depending on whether they are orientated towards charity or not.
