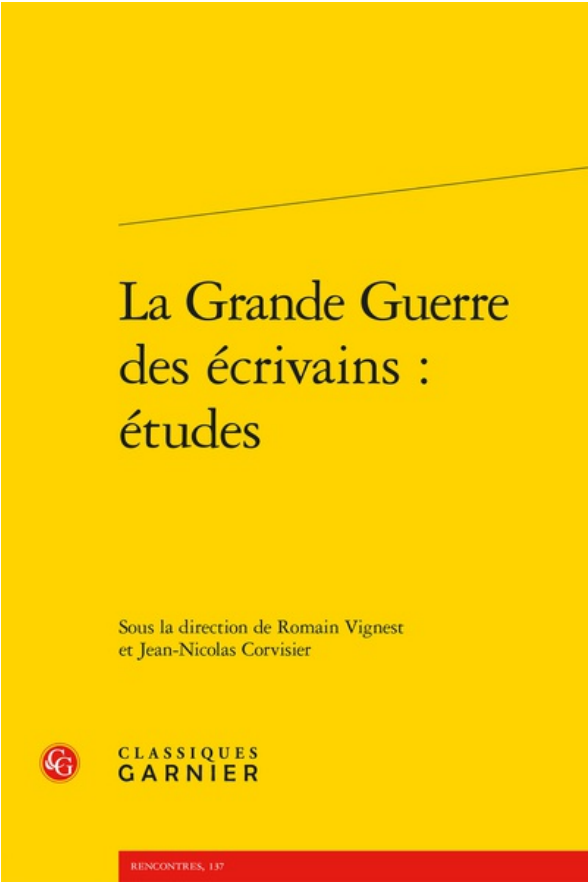


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William Faulkner La Grande Guerre et la fabrique du héros détraqué
