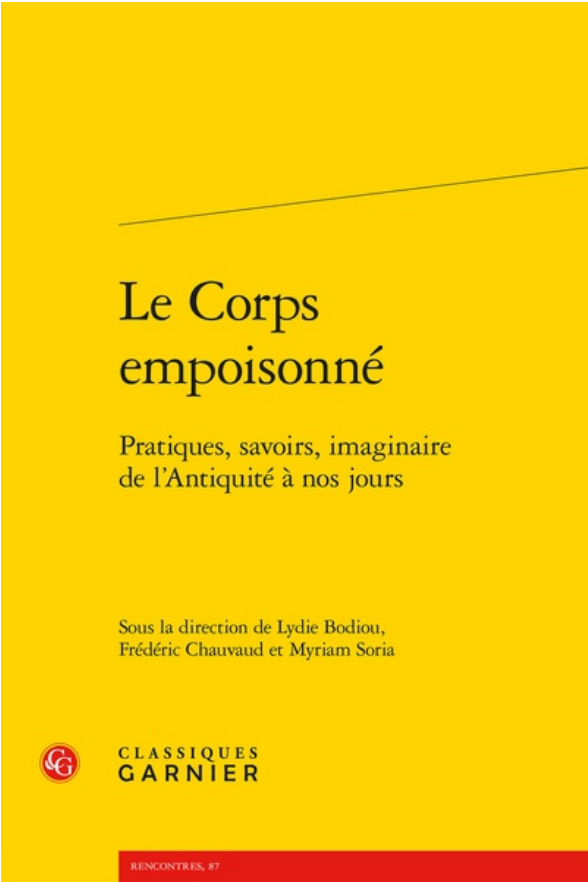


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Poison, médecine et nouvelles technologies dans la série télévisée *Doctor Who* (2005-2012)
